Town Council Meeting Monday, July 10, 2023 6:00 P.M.

Edinburgh Town Council met in a regular session on Monday, July 10, 2023, at 6:00 P.M. at the Town Hall, 107 South Holland Street, Edinburgh, Indiana.

Vice President Dawn Graham called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Councilman Simpson made a motion to schedule a public hearing for the alley vacate request on July 24, 2023. Councilwoman Graham seconded. Motion carried.

## **Public Comments**

Travis Burton of Edinburgh asked if his Polaris Razer fell under the golf cart ordinance.

Town Marshall Doyne Little said it has been brought up before. They fall under an offroad ordinance, and it must be approved for all or none. The golf carts are a separate issue as they are not considered offroad vehicles.
