In May of 1776, Betsy Ross reported that she sewed the first American Flag.

On June 14, 1777, in order to establish an official flag for the new nation, the continental congress passed the first flag act: "Resolved, that the flag of the United States be made of 13 stripes, alternating red and white; that the union be 13 stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."

In 1949 President Harry S. Truman officially named June 14 Flag Day in commemoration of this event.

Between 1777 and 1960, congress passed several acts that changed the shape, design and arrangement of the flag and allowed for additional stars and stripes to be added to reflect the admission of each new state.

Today the flag consists of 13 horizontal stripes, 7 red alternating with 6 white. The stripes represent the original 13 colonies, the stars represent the 50 states of the Union. The colors of the flag are symbolic as well: Red symbolizes Hardiness and Valor, White symbolizes Purity and Innocence, and Blue represents vigilance, Perseverance, and Justice.

Did You Know? Robert G. Heft designed the current flag as a school project when Hawaii and Alaska were being discussed as possible states. He received a B minus for the assignment because his teacher said it lacked creativity. His teacher told him he would receive a higher grade if it was adopted by congress, so he sent it on to his representative, where it eventually became the nations flag.
